Boat Hull Paints

Did you know there are several types of hull paint for your boat? Many hull paints are not permitted in protected waters, like those of Lake Tahoe. If you are in the market for re-painting of your hull, there are some things you may want to consider. In January of 2018, California passed a law regarding the leach rate of copper paints. These paints have a negative effect on water environments and it is important that they are regulated. There are non-copper paints, but some contain Biocide, which acts like a pesticide and is toxic to

marine organisms. Your best choice is a Non-Biocide paint, which is the most environmentally friendly approach. These paints do not contain metals or other active ingredients. The higher upfront application cost will be offset by longer useful life, reduced haul-outs and protection of our waterways. FRUCKEE RIVER RAFTING OUTLOOK

This summer, the rafting season between Tahoe City and River Ranch is expected to last quite a bit longer than last year. The commercial rafting companies that operate in Tahoe City are projecting operating from the end of June through Labor Day. Due to our heavy precipita-

tion in March, full lake levels and steady spring run-off, the Federal Water Master will be able to allow consistent water flow from the lake throughout the summer. The construction on the

connection bridge should not have an impact on rafting, but may impact parking areas near the commercial outlets in town. Please check with the commercial raft

companies if you are making reservations to see if there are any restrictions.

Wild Fire Awareness

Despite a pretty strong finish to our winter, wild fire danger always exists in the Lake Tahoe Basin. As summer visitors come to the area, it is important to remember what types of outdoor burning are safe and legal. Campfires are only allowed in contained outdoor fireplaces that are properly screened and have a total fuel area of 3 feet or less. These also must be located at least 15 feet from a structure of combustible material. These rules also apply to barbeques and grills. On red flag days, no burning is allowed. You can find out if there is a red flag warning by checking www.weather.gov. The US Forest Service has their own regulations for outdoor fire restrictions, so if you will be visiting any of the federal lands in our area, check www. fs.usda.gov to be sure you are up to date with their guidelines.
